FROM THE VICAR

THIS IS HIS STORY, THIS IS OUR SONG



This March we have been running the Easter Prayer trail for the primary school and we begin every session with a reminder that they all come with different beliefs: some may believe in the Christian God, some in another God; some may be uncertain and want to explore, some may not believe or want to.

But each of them can find, in the Easter story, something that connects to their story: something that can help them to think about life and their feelings and experiences and the way we humans behave towards one another and the power of love.

The Easter story contains wild celebration and utter desolation: it seethes with rage and jealousy, fear and pain, joy and hope, love and courage, betrayal and loyalty, doubt and faith, life and death. But at its core, it is a love story. Its central figure, Jesus, literally gives everything for love.

It is a profoundly disturbing, disorientating and disruptive story too, because everything about Jesus seems to turn established common sense on its head.

He is a king, but rides a humble donkey and sleeps rough. He is God, but makes himself the sacrifice instead. He is divine, but sides with the outcasts and the sinners and those others look down on rather than the holy or the powerful. He is all powerful, but allows himself to be made helpless and humiliated. He is our Maker and he lets us unmake him in violence and anger. "Hands that flung stars into space to cruel nails surrendered," Graham Kendrick writes in his song *Servant King*.

Each year as I walk the journey of Holy Week I find new things in the same story.

The wild joy and angry protest of Palm Sunday resonates with my own desire to overthrow the things that hurt and oppress. Judas' betrayal reminds me of my own poor behaviour and that of others towards me.

Jesus' last meal with his friends, full of poignant tenderness as Jesus prepares them for the awful things they will all live through, is very close to my own farewells to loved ones and my own anxieties about the future. As the disciples fall asleep in Gethsemane's garden while Jesus weeps and prays, I feel again the ache of the loneliness of being awake in pain and fear while others are sleeping soundly.

Jesus' rigged trial and unfair beating sparks my longing for justice in the world and my anger at those who use their power to hurt others.

In Pontius Pilate washing his hands and King Herod's mocking I see the indifference and manipulation of leaders and politicians.

Jesus dragging himself to his execution and falling beneath the weight of his cross makes me think of my helplessness in the face of others' suffering. Jesus forgives the soldiers who crucify him and I think of those soldiers whose defence is, "I was just following orders."

Jesus digs deep to find compassion for those around him even as he is dying and his last words are full of love and trust. As I read the eulogy written for a funeral I will be taking, I think about how the thing everyone remembers at a time like that is all the ways they loved and were loved.

Images of Jesus body being placed in the tomb remind me of my own losses: in the wavering flame of the lit candles I confront the fragility of my own life and the reality of my own death.

But then – oh, then, on Easter morning, Mary's tearful joy in the garden as she meets the risen Christ is my own delight at meeting with God just when everything has seemed bleak and hopeless.

Hope is real and love wins and in the Easter story I reflect on my own life and how my story and God's are twined together in new and different ways each year.

Sometimes, when another year has raced by, we can feel as if we are not worth very much, or as if our life does not matter to others or our struggles and joys have no impact on the world, and life is just rushing past us, but God sees us completely.

The Easter story is a love story of God Almighty paying absolute attention to us and our need.

What am I worth? Everything, apparently. And so are you.

THE FIFTY DAYS OF EASTER

While Christmas is famed for its twelve days, fewer people remember that, in the Church calendar, Easter Day marks the beginning of fifty days of celebrating Jesus' resurrection.

The final ten days begin on Ascension day where we celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven. Churches around the country mark the day with services, sometimes outside or on church roofs.

Finally, at the end of the fifty days, we celebrate Pentecost (sometimes called Whitsun) when Jesus' disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. This is often referred to as the birthday of the Church and is celebrated with parties and Whit walks (processions through town).

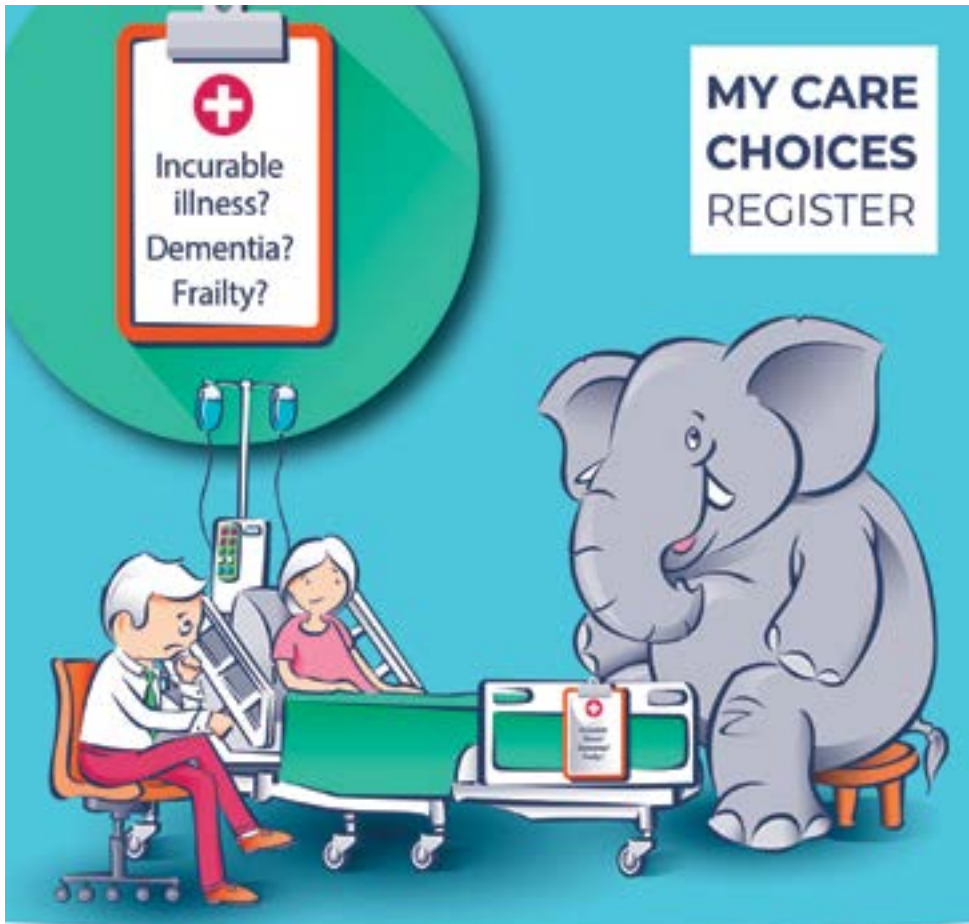

WHO IS LISTENING?

"I always begin my prayer in silence, for it is in the silence of the heart that God speaks". Mother Teresa

Words aren't compulsory – not every time. However, as humans, it comes naturally to communicate by words; spoken or written. We are told in Exodus 33.11 that Moses talked with God 'as with a friend'; and that's a good model. We should feel we can talk with him about anything and everything, as we might to anyone in our lives.

Some prayers are 'arrow' prayers; short and sweet, as something crosses our consciousness.

When we feel inclined to spend a little more time, we can use the Thank you – Sorry – Please pathway. Thanking God for something good; apologizing (sincerely) when we've fouled up; and asking for things that are on your heart, for yourself and for others. This doesn't need to take long, but the more you try it, the easier and more natural and more confident you will feel.

From this you will become more open to God, who is always ready to communicate with us in everything that happens. Our task is to become more attentive to his coming, to listen between the lines, to catch the silent music.

"If you want to pray better, you must pray more"

A MESSAGE FOR EASTER FROM THE RIGHT REV DR GULI FRANCIS-DEHQANI, BISHOP OF CHELMSFORD:

STRENGTH, SOLIDARITY AND THE MISSION FOR JUSTICE

I've recently returned from another trip to Israel and Palestine to show solidarity with our Christian brothers and sisters who continue to live under intolerable conditions.

In the West Bank, in particular, the increase in the number of checkpoints haphazardly and cruelly dominates daily life and the effect of unrestrained illegal settlements perpetuates violence against Palestinians, driving people from their homes.

Communities are being decimated and prospects for a lasting and just peace for all seem bleaker than ever. And, at the time of recording, all this continues while war rages in the Middle East.

During my trip, I was asked to preach at St. Philip's Church in Nablus. But what to say to people living with such pain? I confess I found it quite a challenge.

I offered them greetings from that other beleaguered Christian community close to my heart in Iran. I spoke of Christian hope which persists even through the darkest times, and of the suffering which is at the heart of the Gospel in the way of the cross that Jesus walked.

I spoke too of my solidarity and support in the ongoing cry for justice, also a Christian theme. Finally, I reminded them (and all of us) to continue looking for the good, lest we be overwhelmed by the evil.

For there is always goodness, even in the most vile situations. There is good in shared relationships, in small acts of kindness, courageous resistance, support given and received.

These are glimpses of God's love and presence. They are signs of resurrection – of the life that burst forth as Jesus emerged from the tomb on that first Easter and of resurrection life that still refuses to be subdued.

So, whatever your context and experiences, may God give you grace to continue looking for the good, strength to bear your suffering, and courage to continue speaking and working for justice. I wish you a blessed and joyful Easter.

APRIL RECIPE

EASTER VEGETABLE TART

If you have vegetarians at your Easter table, it is good to have a special celebratory dish, and this one is not difficult to put together and makes a cheerful contribution to your Easter meal.

Ingredients

320 g ready-rolled puff pastry	1 lemon
180 g new potatoes (small)	90 g grated cheese
180 g asparagus	Parmesan (for sprinkling)
250 g mixed spring vegetables (I used peas, broccoli & kale)	250 g ricotta cheese
Bunch mint leaves	1 beaten egg
4 small cherry tomatoes/halved	2 tbsp Olive oil
Salt & pepper	

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200°C; roll out pastry a little thinner so it lines a tin (25cm x 35cm)
2. Make a small edge at each end (roll over about half a centimetre).
3. Cook potatoes for about 5 minutes, then cut into quarters.
4. In a bowl mix the spring vegetables and potatoes in olive oil.
5. Mix together the ricotta & grated cheese with beaten egg, salt & pepper, a tablespoon of chopped mint leaves, grated rind and juice of the lemon – then spread across base of tart.
6. Arrange the oiled vegetables over the tart.
7. Peel the asparagus, then slice into 6 cm batons, about ½ cm wide – arrange over top, along with the 8 halves of tomatoes.
8. Sprinkle with parmesan
9. Bake in oven for 20 minutes then turn oven to 180°C for a further 10 minutes.
10. Serve warm with additional mint leaves to garnish.
